School officials and other interested persons are invited to attend the Educational Approval Board (EAB) 2008 Annual Approved Schools Conference on Thursday, November 13 at the Sheraton Madison Hotel. A [tentative agenda](#) is available.

The theme of this year's conference is "Planning for Success". Dr. Richard Oliver, CEO, American Sentinel University, will present on "The Importance of Planning". Attendees will hear from a panel of EAB schools on lessons learned from the employment verification process.
